

Wiser compared prices of pack sizes, and of branded and private-label products in the tuna category between October and May, at Walmart.

Here's what we saw:

Singles are frozen at the register All single-cans up to 8 oz are flat for the eight-month window.

Multipacks took a haircut Every multi-pack fell 49-65%, as "permanent promo" pricing replaced short-term deals.

January was the bottom Multipacks hit their low in late-January after holiday inventory clear-outs. By May they'd clawed back to ~\$10, still roughly 50% cheaper than October.

Mix matters With singles locked and multipacks halved, any volume shift toward larger packs will drag dollar sales unless unit

There's too much skipjack tuna, too much stock in warehouses, and costs for freight and cans have fallen. Retailers used that backdrop to start a price war, turning short-term promos on multipacks into permanent shelf cuts.

Looking ahead Skipjack raw-fish costs remain soft; another tweak on six-packs is likely in the summer shelf reset. Singles should stay fixed, as they anchor the category's price image.
